

Initially, Ping Lian was hyperactive, living in his own world, not showing affection, not being aware of danger, and unable to hold a pencil to write or use a scissor to cut. To strengthen and develop his fine motor skills, his home program focused on tracing and coloring activities. These activities also kept him occupied, as he was unable to engage in any leisure or social activities. Ping Lian also had very poor imitation skills. Guiding him to trace and draw was one of the ways we developed his imitation skills. Ultimately, tracing became a catalyst for discovering his exceptional artistic talent.

At the age of 8, Ping Lian out-grew tracing and suddenly acquired an obsession with drawing... and he has continued drawing ever since.

He is now an internationally recognized artist. His artworks have been featured in exhibitions in the USA, UK, Australia, Germany, Japan, Korea, Singapore, and Malaysia. Despite his severe social, intellectual, behavioral, and communication limitations, Ping Lian continues to create magnificent works of art. He also continues to donate his works to organizations and charities.

- **March 2003** – Ping Lian's mother wrote in her diary "I want to develop Ping Lian to be an Artist.. I got him to say "I Want to be an Artist" every day..I know he will be an Artist one day.." (she take it as God's vision)!
- **Feb 2004** – Ping Lian's father passed away due to a sudden heart attack. Ping Lian not only lost his dad but his only male friend. His mother decided to take Ping Lian to the art market for "Job training" with hopes he would be able to intergrate into society and be able to travel with her to anywhere... she believes this training needs to start at a very young age.

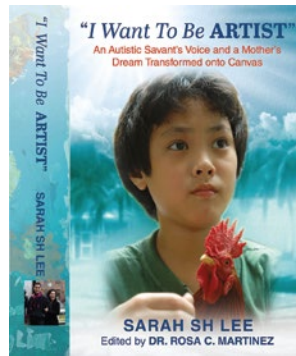
